Importation ban of selected vegetables

• Business Botswana and BOHOCO attended a consultative meeting addressed by the Minister of the Ministry of Agricultural and Food Security, Honourable Molebatsi Molebatsi to discuss the impact of the ban on supply. We proposed that the borders are opened for at least four (4) months to allow citizen farmers to build capacity but farmers requested members of the public to bear with them and seek alternatives.

Agriculture business seminar (Dubai Expo)

• At the invitation of the Botswana Investment and Trade Centre (BITC), the sector chairperson of the Agriculture sector attended and delivered a presentation, under the theme "Ensuring effective food security in Botswana." New programme to replace ISPAAD


